For each Grand Prix, a webpage will be provided in advance for solvers, where you will be presented with the appropriate schedule, supporting announcements and the choice of Category and Notation. Registration is optional but preferred (if only to identify a name rather than your eMail address for the Results and Final Report). Points are awarded according to WCSC guidelines. Results and Final Reports will be published as quickly as possible via STM and www.netchex.club; and also by eMail to all entrants.

For each GP, BOOM points will be awarded to the top 10 solvers as follows:

with an overall results table maintained over the year to decide the Masters Champion.
